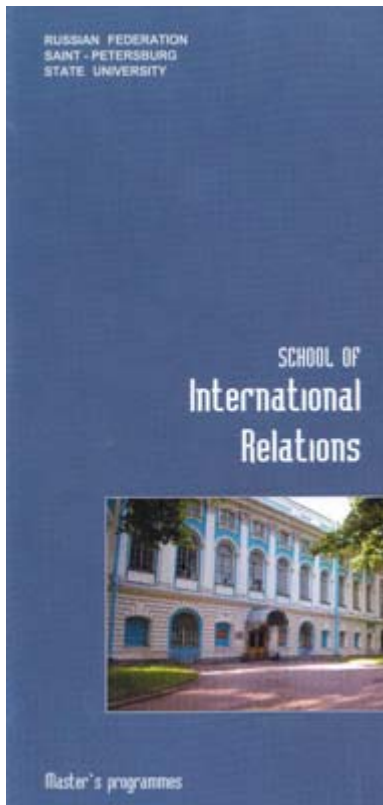

The Saint-Petersburg State University, founded in 1724, is considered to be the oldest University in Russia. The School of International Relations, opened in 1994, is one of the youngest divisions of the University. The School became the first academic institution in Post-Communist Russia where young professionals in the field of International Relations and Area Studies get their skills and knowledge.

For the academic year 2004-05, the School has 826 BA students, 168 MA students and 58 Ph.D. students who came from 30 different countries (Canada, USA, People's Republic of China, France, Norway, Netherlands, Israel, South Korea, Southern Africa, Japan, Bulgaria, Mongolia, Slovakia, Hungary, Finland, Yemen, Peru, Argentina and other countries). Graduates of the School often meet the criteria for employment in executive positions of the state and local authorities like the Ministry for Foreign Affairs, Administration of Saint Petersburg and Leningradskaya oblast. They often work both in Russia and abroad at the state and commercial institutes, in communications and other businesses. A number of our graduates select the academic path and continue their academic careers at many Universities and research centers. We presently have a total of 52 teaching members. Many of our professors have international experience and have graduated from Russian, American and European Universities. Every year, several visiting professors come to teach at the School from countries such as USA, Germany, France, and China. The School holds approximately 10 annual international conferences and many international events.
